

LEAF MARGINS



A leaf is called **entire** when it has a simple, smooth margin with no indentation.

(Lilac)

Latin: integer/in - not tangere - to touch; i.e. 'untouched'



A leaf is called **lobed** when the margin has deep indentations.

(White Oak)

Greek: lobos - lobe



A leaf is called **dented** when it is indented only slightly along the margins.

(Birch)

Middle English: dint – angular incision
