


LEAF SHAPES 3



Runcinate is the name given to a pinnatifid leaf which has a large pointed terminal lobe, while the apexes of the smaller lobes below are directed backwards.

(Dandelion)


Latin: runcina - a plane





Lyrate is the name given to a pinnately veined leaf having a large rounded lobe at the apex and smaller lobes towards the base.

Latin: *lyra* – lyre



Peltate is the name given to a shield-shaped leaf having the petiole attached to the lower surface instead of at the base.

(Nasturtium)

Greek: pelte - shield
