


TYPES OF LEAVES 4




An alternate

arrangement of the leaves on the stem occurs when one leaf is produced at each node, and the leaves are not in a vertical line with each other.

(Wallflower)

Latin:

alternate – to act by turns



The whorled

arrangement of the leaves on the stem occurs when more than two leaves are produced at a node.


(Cross-leafed Heather)

Middle English:

wharle – the whorl of a

spindle

whirl – to go around



The **opposite** arrangement of the leaves on the stem occurs when two leaves spring from one node and face another.

(Privet)

Latin:
opponere - to oppose.
from ob - facing;
positus - placed
