

TYPES OF VENATION 2




A pinnately-veined

leaf has one primary vein (or midrib) with smaller veins arranged on either side of it.

(Oak, Chestnut, Holly, Cherry, Lilac)

Latin:

pinnatus - feathered



A palmately-veined

leaf has more than one primary vein. These veins start from a common point at the base of the blade and extend in different directions, like fingers extend from the palm of the hand.

(Ivy, Sycamore, Castor Bean)

Latin:

palmatus – shaped like the palm of the hand
